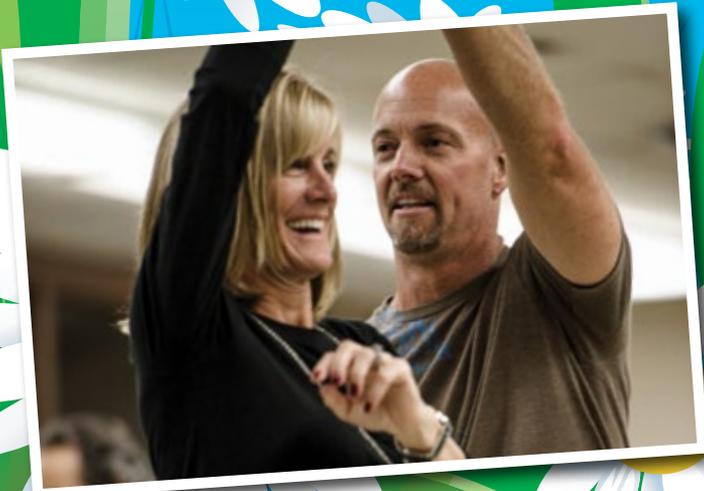

Free Sharps Containers

Have any needles, syringes, scalpels or other sharps? Dispose of them safely and cleanly with a free sharps container from the City of Placentia. You may pick up your free sharps container at City Hall, located at 401 E. Chapman Ave, or the Whitten Center, located at 900 S. Melrose Ave. You may then take your filled sharps container to the Household Hazardous Waste Collection Center located at 1071 North Blue Gum Anaheim, CA 92806. West Nile Virus: What You Need To Know

As the cool winter months approach, mosquitoes are not as noticeable. Experts believe West Nile Virus (WNV) is established as a seasonal epidemic in North America that flares up in the Summer and continues into the Winter. However, it is important to stay vigilant and remember the best way to avoid WNV is to prevent mosquito bites.

When you are outdoors, use insect repellents containing DEET (N, N-diethyl-meta-toluamide).

Many mosquitoes are most active at dusk and dawn. Be sure to use insect repellent and wear long sleeves and pants at these times or consider staying indoors during these hours. Light-colored clothing can help you see mosquitoes that land on you.

Make sure you have good screens on your windows and doors to keep mosquitoes out.

Get rid of mosquito breeding sites by emptying standing water from flower pots, buckets, and barrels. Change the water in pet dishes and replace the water in bird baths weekly. Drill holes in tire swings so water drains out. Keep children's pools empty and on their sides when they aren't being used.

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Free Compost Giveaway

The City of Placentia and Placentia Disposal will hold a FREE Compost Giveaway for residents of Placentia. The special one-day event will be held on **Saturday February 22, from 8:00 am until 10:00 am** (or until the compost runs out) at Tri-City Park. Residents must bring their own containers (no bags please) to receive the loose compost. Each household is entitled to a maximum of 60 gallons of loose compost, which is equivalent to approximately two standard sized trash containers filled half way. The FREE Compost Giveaway is a “thank you” to residents for participating in the yard waste program. Shred Day & Drug Take Back Day

Placentia residents are invited to have their confidential documents destroyed on site for free by Shred-It. Residents will be required to provide proof of residency in order to participate. Documents from businesses will be accepted with proof of the business location in Placentia. E-waste from residents will also be collected by Placentia Disposal. Items such as televisions, computer monitors, game consoles, stereos, cell phones, microwaves and any item containing circuit boards will be collected. Any unused or expired medication will be collected by the DEA. Hazardous materials or business e-waste will not be accepted. Join the community in helping prevent fraud and identity theft. Stormwater Tips for Spring Projects

Whether your spring project is a new coat of paint, a thorough house cleaning, or major remodeling, taking some simple preventative measures will keep the waste materials that might be created from polluting our environment.

Painting: Prevent spills by placing your opened paint cans into secondary containment such as a cat litter box or an old cookie sheet. It is imperative that you do not hose down spilled paint.

Landscaping: Protect stockpiles of materials from wind and rain by covering them with tarps or plastic sheeting. Deliveries of soil, sand or fertilizer must not be unloaded onto the street or gutter.

Concrete: When demolishing existing pavement, remove and recycle all the waste concrete chunks. You can call Placentia Disposal, Inc. at (714) 238-3300 for assistance with obtaining a waste bin that will suit your needs. Do not wash concrete mixers or pumps into the gutter or street.

Looking to dispose of your used oil and oil filters? Pick up your free 15 qt. oil container and your dual capacity oil filter recycling container at City Hall, located at 401 E. Melrose Ave. These containers make it easy storing your used oil and oil filters cleanly, safely, and ready for pickup or drop off at a certified used oil recycling location. 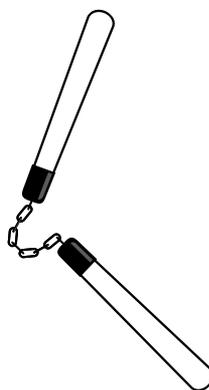

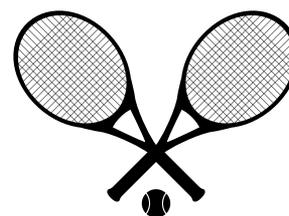

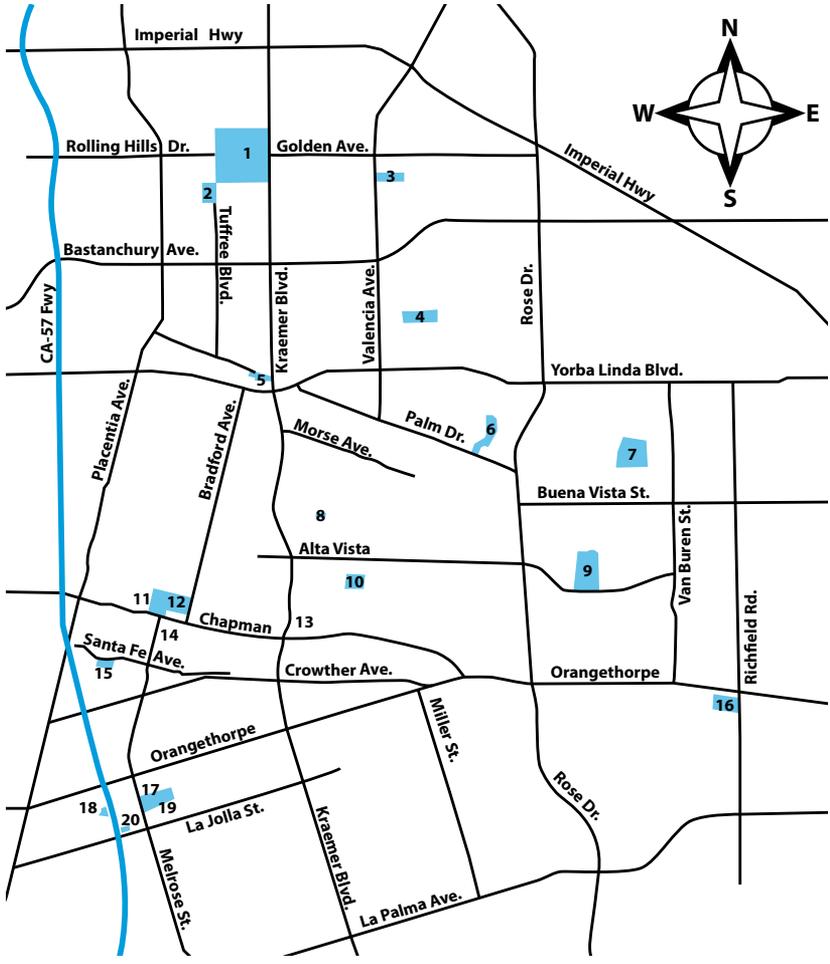

Earn certifications to become a lifeguard. This course teaches lifeguard candidates the skills and knowledge to prevent and respond to aquatics emergencies. Participants must be 15+ and upon successful completion will receive certifications in American Red Cross (ARC) Lifeguard Training and First Aid and ARC CPR/AED for Lifeguards. This course includes a three day session. All three days must be attended. All three classes must be taken in order to complete the course. Fee of \$175. 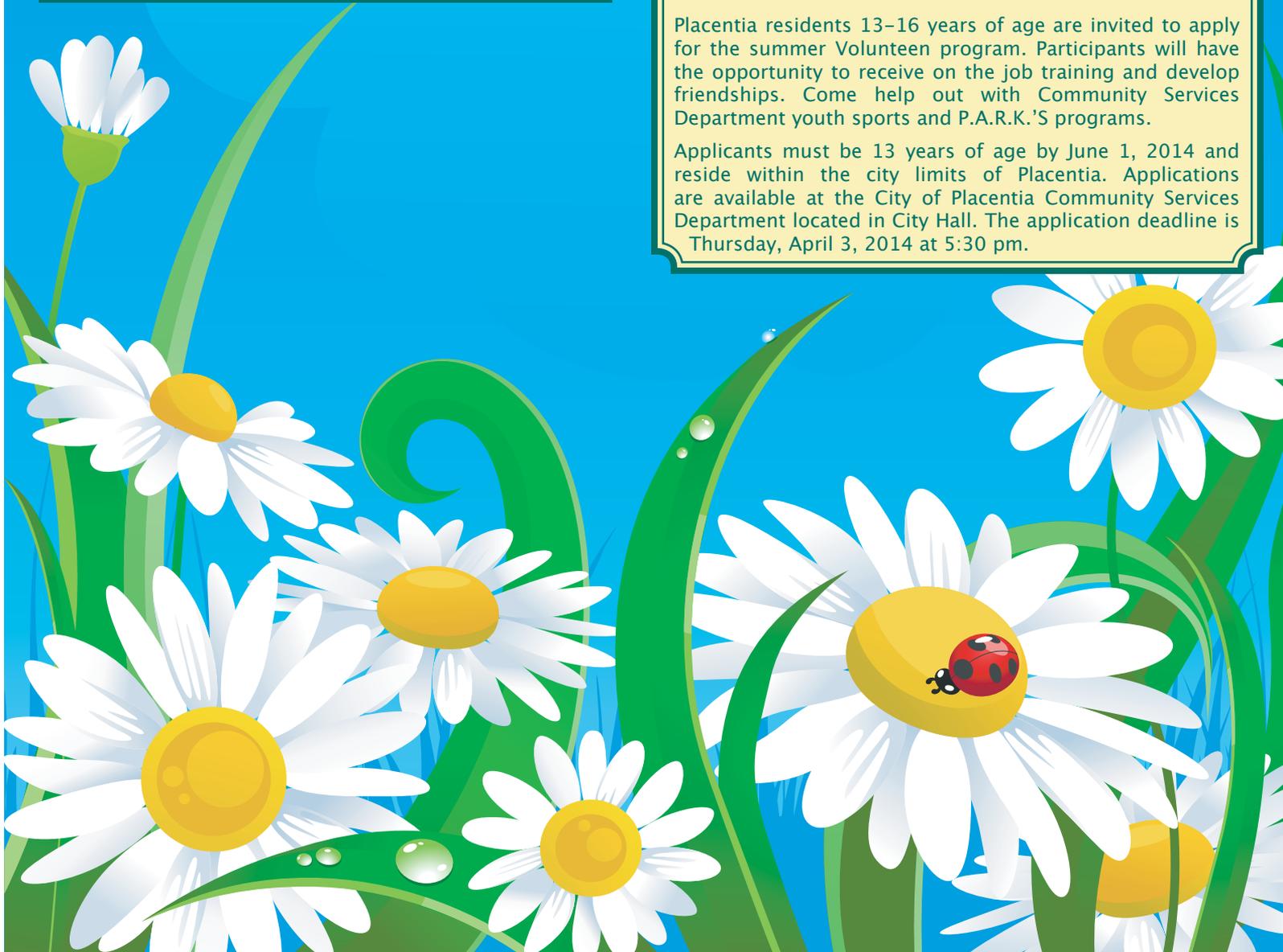
