

## MEASURE U

Placentia's Tax Dollars At Work

In November, Placentia voters overwhelmingly approved Measure U, a 1% sales tax increase to help fund the cost of much needed infrastructure repairs and maintenance as well as public safety and other critical services. Measure U sales tax increase began collection on April 1, 2019. The City received the first remittance of Measure U in July 2019. For the first time in many years, the City will be able to fund much needed road and infrastructure repairs. The City Council has allocated a total of \$3.2 million in Measure U, SB 1 Gas Tax and Measure M proceeds to continue funding street repairs and maintenance for Fiscal Year 2019-2020. Projects include repaving more than 800,000 square feet of arterial streets and slurry sealing more than 2.6 million square feet of residential streets and sidewalk/curb improvements.



Below is a list of additional new projects and improvements funded by Measure U this year:

- Park improvements at Parque Del Arroyo Verde, Champion Sports Park, and Samp Park
- Upgrades at City facilities including pool lifts, Tynes Gym roof replacement and Aguirre Building restroom updates
- Police Station improvements
- Police and Public Works vehicle replacement
- Police SWAT Van

## DOWNLOAD THE iPLACENTIA MOBILE APP TODAY

The City of Placentia's mobile app iPlacentia makes it easier than ever to report issues within City limits and make local City government accessible to its residents. iPlacentia allows users to instantly submit service requests for issues such as potholes, graffiti, street light outages, trash, and so much more. The app uses GPS technology to provide the problem's exact location and it is automatically submitted to the responsible department for review. The requester will be notified when the issue has been received and resolved.

Additional features of the mobile app allow residents to read about the latest City news and events, register for recreational classes and activities, renew a business license, access permit applications, view job openings, contact City Council or Staff, and more!

iPlacentia is available for free download on all iPhone and Android devices. Simply search "iPlacentia" in the App Store or GooglePlay. Residents without internet access can report service requests by phone at (714) 993-8131. For troubleshooting with the app, please call (714) 993-8171. The iPlacentia App is not intended for use in reporting emergency situations or crimes in progress. If you have an emergency, please dial 9-1-1.

## DID YOU KNOW.....

### BULKY-ITEM & E-WASTE COLLECTION PROGRAM

Help Keep our neighborhood, streets, and alleys free of unwanted furniture, appliances, and other bulky items by using Republic Services for bulky item pick-up. If an item won't fit in your trash container, contact Republic Services. All single-family residential customers are entitled to three (3) free bulky item pick-ups per year. Additional pickups are available for a fee. Bulky item pick-ups for multi-family dwelling, properties with five (5) units or more, and businesses come at a cost. Bulky items include, but are not limited to, furniture, water heaters, large appliances, electronic waste and other bulky items. There is a disposal fee for items containing CFC's Freon. For more information and/or to schedule a bulky item pick-up, please call Republic Services at (714) 238-2444.

If you are doing a large clean-out or remodeling your home, call Republic Services at (714) 238-2444 to learn more about renting a larger waste container. These can be delivered to your driveway and picked up when you have filled them.

Remember that household hazardous waste is NOT picked up at the curb. If you have unneeded household chemicals, such as tub and tile cleaner, toilet bowl cleaner, paint, stain, paint thinner, used motor oil, antifreeze, pool chemicals, pesticides, and similar hazardous products, you may dispose of them for FREE at the Orange County Household Hazardous Waste (HHW) Collection Centers, which are open Tuesday through Saturday, from 9:00 AM - 3:00 PM (closed major holidays and during rainy weather). To confirm whether centers are open during rain events, call (714) 834-4000.

## TEXT TO 9-1-1 IS NOW AVAILABLE IN PLACENTIA

Text messaging provides support for wireless subscribers to send 9-1-1 text messages to Public Safety Departments by texting to 9-1-1. Texting to 9-1-1 was designed as a secondary service or alternative to a voice call. It is important to provide equal access to emergency services for the deaf, hard of hearing and speech impaired community as well as an alternate method of reporting emergencies when traditional avenues are unavailable or it is too dangerous to make a voice call. This service is available in all of Orange County.


A few things to know about Text-To-9-1-1...

- 1 Finding your location from the location of your phone is more difficult when texting – know where you are and text the address or a description.
- 2 .When texting 9-1-1 for an emergency, the first message should be the location of the emergency (including city) and the type of emergency help needed (police, fire or medical).
- 3 Dispatchers can't receive photos, videos or emojis when you're texting 9-1-1.
- 4 If you include 9-1-1 on a group text, it will not go through to dispatchers.
- 5 It's a crime to text 9-1-1 with a false report. 9-1-1 is vital to get emergency services to those who need it most. Calling or texting 9-1-1 when it's not an emergency or just to have fun is a crime. You can face up to a year in County jail, and a fine of up to \$1,000.

Some of the limitations of the text to 9-1-1 system are that there is no language translation services and location accuracy varies by wireless provider. The caller should provide the location. Texting is not a real time two-way messaging system. Waiting for responses between message sender and 9-1-1 centers may delay call handling and response time. Due to these limitations, you should always contact 9-1-1 by making a voice call, if you can.

# THE CITY OF PLACENTIA'S MASS NOTIFICATION SYSTEMS: ALERTOC AND NIXLE

After many deadly wildfires ravaged Northern and Southern California, many people were left wondering, "Why didn't the city adequately notify the residents of the incoming fire?" Unfortunately, with the change in technology and limits that the government has to send notifications to mobile devices, a significant amount of the population will not receive emergency alerts in the event that a local emergency has occurred or is approaching. To mitigate this problem, many cities within the State of California and Orange County have implemented alternative emergency alert platforms to notify the general public in ways that are more in-line with the type of technology that exists and innovative platforms that are adaptive to the mobile lifestyles that many people have on a daily basis.

The City of Placentia actively uses two mass notification and emergency alert platforms: Nixle and AlertOC. Both AlertOC and Nixle allow for emergency alerts to be sent to your mobile device(s) and e-mail(s) if there are incidents going on within the city that are deemed important enough to warrant public notification. The primary benefit of the system is immediate, straight-from-the-source information that informs the public of various incidents.

Although the systems are similar, the City has elected to use the platforms in two distinct ways to allow for people to decide which platform works the best for their interest. The benefit of these systems can be seen in three critical ways when reaching out to members of the community. First, as our communities discontinue the use of landlines and traditional television within their homes, the City no longer has the capacity to reach people in the traditional ways that we have in previous years; the AlertOC and Nixle systems fill those gaps and provide similar or greater access to emergency alerts in the City.

Next, the use of the AlertOC and Nixle systems allows the City to provide rapid and specific information to the members of a specific community without delay. Previously, the City would have to reach out to the County or private partners to organize a message and have it sent out to homes only; the two systems provide the City with the capacity to send out emergency and advisory alerts to the community in an expedited manner and reduce the likelihood that a message may be changed during transmission.

Finally, the AlertOC and Nixle platforms allow subscribed members of the community to receive notifications while they are at work, traveling, and messages that are critical to family members (e.g. children's school, parent's home). The systems' ability to reach people away from the City is critical because we want to make sure that we are providing the best information to members of our community, even if they are not within the city.

The AlertOC platform is used only in the event of widespread emergencies that require immediate action by members of the community. Alerts that will come from the AlertOC will also be sent to homes that have a dedicated landline via reverse 9-1-1 data, but the alerts will not connect to individual mobile devices that have not opt-ed into the AlertOC system. To opt into the AlertOC system, send a text message to 888777 and place "ALERTOC" into the body of the text message.

The Nixle platform is used on a general basis to inform the public of various incidents which include, but are not limited to, police activity that impacts a neighborhood, accidents which impact traffic flow, road closures, or general notifications that the City has deemed important enough for the public to be notified of quickly. To opt into the Nixle system, send a text message to 888777 and place Placentia's ZIP Code – "92870" – in to the body of the text message.

With the implementation of these platforms, the systems are only effective with more people being enrolled into the systems. Additionally, the people that we encourage you to reach out to are the members of the community that are not familiar with signing-up for emergency alerts on a mobile device or are not technologically-proficient. By helping these members of our community sign-up for AlertOC and Nixle, the City of Placentia will be able to effectively reach the greatest number of people and potentially save the greatest amount of lives.

# ADDRESSING HOMELESSNESS IN PLACENTIA

The City of Placentia is taking a proactive approach toward addressing homelessness including establishing a Navigation Center within the City. The Navigation Center provides the supportive resources necessary to successfully transition homeless persons into permanent housing. After hosting several community meetings for input, the City Council approved the purchase of 731 S. Melrose Street to serve as the Navigation Center. The City is in the process of a Request for Proposal (RFP) for a site operator/service provider and will be retaining a contractor for construction to complete improvements to the property.

A Navigation Center will empower our local law enforcement with the tools necessary to prevent camping on public locations, including the freeway underpass on Crowther and the 57 Freeway.

The City of Placentia has created a Homelessness Task Force that meets regularly and works with agencies including Caltrans, BNSF, HIS House, and CHP to address issues affecting multiple jurisdictions including scheduling regular cleanings for areas affecting the 57 Freeway underpass. Now that the Settlement Agreement is complete, a temporary cleaning of the encampment was completed on August 27, 2019. The cleaning included powerwashing the sidewalk, clearing the area, debris removal, and the addition of a yellow line on the sidewalk to maintain 36 inches of walkable space per the Americans with Disabilities Act (ADA). Until such time as the Navigation Center is complete, the encampment can remain under the freeway. In addition, the Placentia Police Department and Public Works Department visit the site frequently throughout the day to address and monitor the encampment.

The City is dedicated to addressing homelessness in the City and will continue to work to open the Navigation Center by early 2020, which will then allow our Police Department to enforce our local anticamping ordinance throughout the City, including the Crowther encampment. ## PLACENTIA POLICE DEPARTMENT CITIZEN'S ACADEMY

Have you ever wondered, "what goes on behind the scenes at the Placentia Police Department?" Well, you are in luck! The Placentia Police Department will be hosting our 5th Citizen's Academy starting this September to introduce members of the community to all of divisions and roles of the Placentia Police Department!

The Citizen's Academy is a 10-week, no-stress course designed to provide community members with a better understanding of their community's police department, and to help foster effective communication between all citizens and the personnel that serve our community.

The Citizen's Academy will include an overview and hands-on training in various areas of the department, which include: the structure of the Placentia Police Department, Investigations Division, Traffic Division, accident investigation, DUI (Driving Under the Influence) investigations, the Gang Unit, Narcotics, the Emergency Services Division, Crime Prevention, Crime Scene Investigation, the K-9 program, and volunteer programs associated with the City of Placentia.

During the Citizen's Academy, members of the community will have an opportunity to tour the police facility, see the patrol vehicles, and see the equipment used by the department on a daily basis. At the conclusion of the Citizen's Academy, graduates will receive a Placentia Police Department certificate of completion. ## BACK TO SCHOOL EMERGENCY EARTHQUAKE PREPAREDNESS

As families prepare for the upcoming school year, it is important to take a fresh look at preparing for the next big earthquake. On October 17th, schools, workplaces, and many governmental agencies across California will take part in the Great California Shake-Out. With school right around the corner, we should all make emergency preparedness a critical part of our back to school routine to ensure that our families and students are ready for the sudden shock of an earthquake.

Many people may be familiar with the old “duck and cover” campaign; while you should still immediately drop to your hands and knees while covering your neck and head, it is now recommended that you also hold on to the object which you are under, so you will move with the object if it shifts. Standing in doorways or the triangle of life are no longer recognized as safe; however, if you are outside, make sure you still drop and cover. Be sure to refresh your family, especially children, on these procedures for an earthquake or stage your own earthquake drill at home to identify areas which are safer than others.

A critical part is preparing your home and vehicle(s) for an emergency by creating multiple emergency kits. Best practices should allow you to have snacks, and at minimum, one-gallon of water, per person, per day for at least three days at your home, and water and small snacks in your vehicle. After a devastating earthquake, most people’s number one concern will be reuniting with loved ones and beginning the recovery process; however, being prepared with basic supplies and tools at home and away will ensure that your student and family have access to the tools and supplies that may decrease recovery times.

If your student is home before you are or utilizing the bus systems, parents should discuss with their students the best ways of reuniting after a disaster. Together, families should determine who will pick up children or where to meet, how to establish contact, and practice the plan! Communication plans are helpful contingencies regardless of the emergency situation.

After the “Big One,” traffic may be gridlocked due to closed and damaged roadways and families may be separated as many people may become stranded at work or in transit. Drivers should create a small kit for their vehicles with basic necessities for roughly 24 hours. A pack of water, snack bars, a change of clothes and a toothbrush can make the difference if you find yourself away from home when a disaster strikes.

For students, school may be the safest place during an earthquake due to regulations which have greatly improved school structures in California. Schools often serve as hosts for disaster shelter; therefore, children may be advised to wait at school for reunification.

Here’s some additional tips for everyone:

- Save address and contact information for your student’s school.
- Subscribe to Placentia’s Nixle Alert System by texting 92870 to 888777.
- Have students keep a hard copy of parents/guardians contact info.
- Ensure your student has access to life-sustaining medication, if required.

The time directly following a disaster can be some of the most terrifying and uncertain times in a person’s life, but simple measures today can make recovery and reunification less stressful. # PLACENTIA BURIAL FLAG PROGRAM

The Burial Flag Program allows the families of deceased Placentia Veterans to fly the burial flag of their loved ones at the Placentia Civic Center Veterans Memorial.

Under this Program, the City would fly a burial flag, which is provided by the family of a deceased veteran, at the Placentia Civic Center Veterans Memorial for one business week. Following that period of time, the flag will be lowered and returned with a certificate to the family. After the burial flag has been lowered, a flag will be raised to commemorate and honor all Veterans or another burial flag will be raised.



Guidelines:

- Applications received on a first come first serve basis.
- Applicants must provide proof of honoree's residency in Placentia and military service.
- Veterans Advisory Committee will review all applications received.
- Veterans Advisory Committee will approve or disapprove applications.
- Official government issued burial flag is to be provided by applicant.
- Size of burial flag must be 5' x 9.5'.
- Burial Flags will be flown in front of the Veterans Memorial at the Placentia Civic Center.
- Veterans Advisory Committee will coordinate with the applicants on receiving the flag and the date and time of the raising/ lowering of the flag.
- Veterans Advisory Committee will coordinate the returning of the flag to the applicant or retire the flag.

## PLACENTIA POLICE DEPARTMENT | K-9 FALKON IN MEMORIAM: K-9 FALKON

On May 9th, the Placentia Police Department hosted a memorial and internment of ashes service for Police Service Dog (PSD) Falkon. A Malinois imported from Slovakia, Falkon began his career with the Placentia Police Department in 2007 at the age of 18 months. Falkon was a highly trained PSD, including criminal apprehension, narcotic detection, and article searches. Falkon accomplished many notable seizures and captures:

- 60 kilos of cocaine hidden in a compartment inside of a vehicle
- 125 pounds of marijuana concealed inside a gas tank
- 20 pounds of heroin hidden in a compartment of a vehicle
- 20 gallons of liquid methamphetamine concealed inside a gas tank
- Drug sniff of an industrial building led to a search warrant and the discovery of an illegal marijuana grow
- Apprehension of an armed robbery suspect after a lengthy pursuit. The suspect was still armed with a handgun and responsible for armed robberies in California and Louisiana.

In addition to numerous apprehensions and drug seizures, Falkon was known for his calm and friendly disposition. He provided demonstrations for local schools, community events, and organizations. Falkon retired in 2015 after 7½ years of dedicated and faithful service to the City of Placentia. Upon completing his service life, Falkon spent his well-deserved retirement with Captain Eric Point, a former Department K9 Handler, as a loving member of the family.





# FIRE PROTECTION & EMERGENCY MEDICAL SERVICES UPDATE

## CITY OF PLACENTIA ESTABLISHES LOCAL FIRE DEPARTMENT

Many in the community don't know that our fire services have been provided on a contract basis by an outside provider. Since 2009, the City's costs with the contract service provider, Orange County Fire Authority, have grown by 47%, with no change in service levels being provided to our residents. At the same time, the Placentia Police Department has experienced a 9% decrease in its operating budget. Placentia has a responsibility to its residents to ensure local fire and paramedic models are continually improving, high-quality, and fiscally sustainable.

We are excited to announce, following a comprehensive evaluation process, Placentia will become a "full service" city for its residents by forming its own, local City of Placentia Fire and Life Safety Department and bringing on a highly-qualified, paramedic EMS service provider to improve 911 services.

A local, neighborhood-based, City of Placentia Fire Department significantly improves 911 emergency response times and life-saving services to our residents. The City has retained a highly-qualified Interim Fire Chief who is in the process of hiring all fire personnel necessary including Battalion Chiefs, Captains, Engineers, Firefighters, and Reserves. The Placentia Fire Department has already begun obtaining the most advanced and technologically capable fire equipment and apparatus available in the industry to ensure our new local City Fire Department has the best life-saving tools to serve our community. The state-of-the-art apparatus includes: two Type I Fire Engines, one Quint Fire Engine with a 100-foot ladder, one mini-pumper apparatus, communications equipment, and accompanying equipment including lightbars, hoses, nozzles, any necessary rescue equipment, hand tools and submersible pumps.

The apparatus and equipment have been recommended specifically for Placentia based upon risk profile, calls for service, and extended useful service life. In addition to the apparatus, Placentia will purchase support vehicles including three incident command units for the Chief and Battalion Chiefs, a passenger van for staff transportation and training and a utility pickup truck to transport tools and equipment.

In addition, the City will deploy the latest technology and enhanced paramedic staffing models to respond to 911 emergencies. The new service provider Lynch Ambulance Services is highly-certified, has over three decades of experience, and is accredited by the Orange County Medical Director. This improved service model places dedicated 911 certified paramedic responders where they are needed most throughout the City. This will shorten response times to 911 emergencies and increase capacity to dispatch ambulances quickly — saving lives, time and money.

The City is excited to offer this new service model at no additional cost to our residents. In fact, this new locally-controlled model actually saves taxpayer dollars while providing enhanced life-saving emergency medical services.

As we move forward, Placentia will continue to take the decisive steps necessary to ensure a seamless transition into establishing our own localized, neighborhood-based fire department. Residents should still call 911 for emergencies or (714) 993-8164 for non-emergencies. The new Placentia Fire Department will begin its first shift at midnight July 1, 2020. 
