PLACENTIA'S "EXPAND THE FOREST" PROGRAM

The City is still welcoming applications for its Expand the Forest Program! This program, adopted as part of the City's Urban Forest Management Program, provides residents with an opportunity to purchase and dedicate a tree to the community to commemorate a loved one or special event. Planting a tree in a City Park is a special way to honor someone and also provides a gift to the whole community by contributing to the expansion of the City's Urban Forest. A dedication tree can be planted in a City Park and, potential tree sponsors can use a Park map to identify their preferred park and planting location(s). The cost to purchase and plant a tree will be funded by the tree sponsor and is based on the current contract price paid by the City for 24-inch box trees. The current cost is \$300 for an Expand the Forest tree. Once a location is selected

and payment for the tree has been received, the City will arrange to have the tree planted by the City's landscape maintenance contractor, with or without the sponsor(s) in attendance, depending on their preference. Once planted, the City will assume maintenance responsibilities to care for the tree. The tree sponsor(s) will receive a certificate signed by the Mayor in appreciation for their tree sponsorship and be acknowledged in this newsletter!

Residents can participate by completing an Expand the Forest Program application and submitting it to the Public Works Department via email at urbanforest@placentia.org or via mail at 401 E. Chapman Avenue, Placentia, CA 92870. The application is available online for download at www.placentia.org/urbanforest and at City Hall through the Public Works Department.

iPLACENTIA

The City of Placentia's mobile app iPlacentia makes it easier than ever to report issues within City limits and make local City government accessible to its residents. iPlacentia allows users to instantly submit service requests for issues such as potholes, graffiti, streetlight outages, trash, and so much more. The app uses GPS technology to provide the problem's exact location and it is automatically submitted to the responsible department for review. The requester will be notified when the issue has been received and resolved.

Additional features of the mobile app allow residents to read about the latest City news and events, register for recreational classes and activities, renew a business license, access permit applications, view job openings, contact City Council or Staff, and more!

iPlacentia can be downloaded for free on all iPhone and Android devices. Simply search "iPlacentia" in the App Store or GooglePlay. Residents without internet access can report service requests by phone at (714) 993-8131. For troubleshooting with the app, please call (714) 993-8171. The iPlacentia App is not intended for use in reporting emergency situations or crimes in progress. If you have an emergency, please dial 9-1-1.

PROPOSED CITY SEWER SYSTEM RATE ADJUSTMENTS

On Tuesday, July 6, 2021, the City Council will conduct a public hearing to consider increases to the City's sewer service rates. The City Council held a study session on March 16 and April 20, 2021 to review a recently completed Sewer System Cost Recovery Study. On May 4, 2021, the City Council adopted Resolution No. R-2021-20 and directed Staff to initiate the Proposition 218 proceedings and set the public hearing date to consider the proposed rates. A public hearing notice to all affected property owners in the City was mailed on Friday, May 21, 2021.

Why are rate changes being considered?

The City recently completed the 2020 Sewer Cost Recovery Rate Study and developed a financial plan that guides investment in the sewer system over the next five years. The City has not adjusted the sewer rates in 16 years since the rates were first adopted in March 2005 even though the costs associated with maintaining the City's sewer system continue to rise. Financially, the City's sewer system is operated as a self-supporting enterprise that relies on revenues from sewer rates to fund the cost of providing service. The sewer rates collected from property owners generate the revenue to operate and maintain the City's aging system and invest in necessary replacements and upgrades. The current rates are insufficient to fund


ongoing services. The study recommends the adoption of a five-year rate schedule to address the cost of inflation on items needed to inspect, repair, operate, maintain, and perform needed capital improvements.

How will the proposed rates be utilized?

The City's sewer system is aging and the majority of it is constructed of vitrified clay pipe (VCP) material. VCP is a fairly brittle pipe that is more prone to deterioration and leads to joint separation and cracks in the pipe. With the proposed rates, the City seeks to continue the safe operation of the City's sewer system and will 1) fully fund operations and maintenance costs and 2) necessary capital improvement projects totaling \$13 million that include relining of sewer pipes, replacement of broken VCP pipes, and increasing capacity to meet the future needs of the City.

FIRE PROTECTION & EMERGENCY MEDICAL SERVICES UPDATE

PLACENTIA FIRE & LIFE SAFETY DEPARTMENT & LYNCH EMS ARE REACHING NEW HEIGHTS IN 2021

It has been an exciting year for Placentia Fire & Life Safety (PFLS) & Lynch EMS since the City launched its new Fire Protection & EMS Services on July 1, 2020. We hired our charter full-time personnel as laterals from other fire departments and all firefighters have adapted well to Placentia, especially working with our partners at Lynch EMS.

With Lynch paramedics providing the ALS (Advanced Life Support) function and our firefighters providing BLS (Basic Life Support) together, we have formed a well-oiled and cohesive all-hazard response team.

Community Connect

Our Lynch paramedics and PFLS firefighters have been out on the streets promoting Community Connect, a database that

is tied to our state-of-the-art pre-plan software FIRST DUE. Community Connect gives citizens the ability to help build pre-plans that aids firefighters and paramedics when responding to a call at a home or business. In addition to this program, our firefighters and paramedics have been working with community groups, teaching sidewalk CPR, first aid, and disaster preparedness.

Personnel Updates

We are excited to announce that two of our members recently completed the Fire Captains Academy. The academy consisted of two weeks of training on leadership, employee relations, fire tactics, and strategy, and much more. We are currently in the process of recruiting a Deputy Fire Chief and will soon begin to recruit for a Training Officer and additional Reserve Firefighters. To date, we have had three of our reserves promote to full-time positions as firefighters, while others have been hired with other agencies based on their experience in Placentia.

The men and women of Placentia Fire & Life Safety & Lynch EMS are truly proud to be a part of the Placentia family and community. Together, we have a combination of specialized training, emergency experience, and formal education that has prepared us to provide emergency services to the citizens of Placentia. Together we stand in our commitment to uphold our core values: "Integrity, dedication, community and respect!"

TEXT TO 9-1-1 IS NOW AVAILABLE IN PLACENTIA

Text messaging provides support for wireless subscribers to send 9-1-1 text messages to Public Safety Departments by texting to 9-1-1. Texting to 9-1-1 was designed as a secondary service or alternative to a voice call. It is important to provide equal access to emergency services for the deaf, hard of hearing and speech impaired community as well as an alternate method of reporting emergencies when traditional avenues are unavailable or it is too dangerous to make a voice call. This service is available in all of Orange County.

A few things to know about Text-To-9-1-1...

1. Finding your location from the location of your phone is more difficult when texting – know where you are and text the address or a description.
2. When texting 9-1-1 for an emergency, the first message should be the location of the emergency (including city) and the type of emergency help needed (police, fire or medical).
3. Dispatchers can't receive photos, videos or emojis when you're texting 9-1-1.
4. If you include 9-1-1 on a group text, it will not go through to dispatchers.

Calling or texting 9-1-1 when it's not an emergency or just to have fun is a crime. You can face up to a year in County jail, and a fine of up to \$1,000.

Some of the limitations of the text to 9-1-1 system are that there is no language translation services and location accuracy varies by wireless provider. The caller should provide the location. Texting is not a real time two-way messaging system. Waiting for responses between message sender and 9-1-1 centers may delay call handling and response time. Due to these limitations, you should always contact 9-1-1 by making a voice call, if you can.

The City of Placentia invites you to participate in a free community Drive-Thru Shred Event on Saturday, June 12th from 8:00 am to 12:00 pm at the Placentia Civic Center, 401 East Chapman Avenue. Shredding documents can help prevent fraud and identity theft. Placentia residents and businesses are invited to have their confidential documents destroyed on-site for free by Shred-It. A maximum of four (4) banker box-sized containers will be accepted from each household or business location in Placentia. No electronic items, hazardous materials, or business e-waste will be accepted at this event. At this contactless drive-thru event, we ask that all participants stay in their vehicles and have their shred items packaged in a bag(s) or box(es) in their back seat or trunk. SWIM LESSON DESCRIPTIONS

Big Fish, Lil' Fish **9 months to 3 years**

A basic water orientation class for tots and their parents. The child and parent work on skills together in the water. Skills include water adjustment, blowing bubbles, kicking, holding onto the wall, floating on back, water entry and exit, face submergence, and safety skills. A parent is required to accompany each child.

Tiny Tots **3 to 5 years**

A class for preschoolers who have very little to no aquatic experience. Fun and safety are emphasized while learning necessary swimming skills such as water entry and exit, face submergence, blowing bubbles, water adjustment, kicking, exploring arm movements, and safety skills.

Level 1 **5 to 12 years**

A class for children who have very little to no aquatic experience. Fun and safety are emphasized while learning necessary swimming skills: water entry and exit, face submergence, water adjustment, floating on front and back, retrieval of submerged objects, and safety skills. In this class children will learn how to side breathe as well as practice freestyle and backstroke.

Level 2 **5 to 12 years**

Class reviews entry by stepping or jumping from side, bobbing, head submergence and holding breath, floating on front and back, treading water, side breathing, freestyle, backstroke, and safety skills. Participants will also be introduced to elementary backstroke.

Level 3 **5 to 12 years**

In this class, children will review side breathing techniques, freestyle, backstroke, and elementary backstroke. They will also be introduced to breaststroke and kneeling and standing dives. Participants will continue to practice treading water, retrieving submerged objects, and safety skills.

Prerequisite – Participants should be very confident freestyle swimmers and comfortable with backstroke and breaststroke.


