DON'T FALL VICTIM TO FRAUD

With identity theft on the rise, the Placentia Police Department wants to provide some helpful identity theft prevention tips:

- Do not give personal information over the phone, such as your birthdate or social security number.
- Do not open emails from anyone you don't know and do not click on a link or download an attachment.
- Do not reply to text messages from a number you do not recognize. If you receive a text message from a bank regarding a possible fraud transaction, call the bank.
- Do not share passwords or login information with anyone.
- Do not send checks in the mail.

Get your free credit reports from TransUnion, Experian, and Equifax. Go to www.annualcreditreport.com or call 1-877-322-8228.

Review your reports. If you find any accounts or charges you don't recognize, go to www.IdentityTheft.gov to report the theft and notify the credit bureaus.

FIRE PREVENTION WEEK: OCTOBER 8TH - OCTOBER 14TH

Fire Prevention Week is sponsored by the National Fire Protection Association (NFPA) each year and was proclaimed a National Observance in 1925 by President Calvin Coolidge. During Fire Prevention Week, people of all ages learn how to stay safe in case of a fire. Each year during the week of October 9th, Fire Prevention Week is observed in commemoration of the devastating Great Chicago Fire, which began on October 8, 1871. Placentia Fire and Life Safety's role as the local fire department is to provide lifesaving public education based on the NFPA yearly theme to reduce casualties caused by fires.



Many jurisdictions celebrate by hosting an open house event, inviting the public to learn about fire and life safety while seeing our department, including our personnel, apparatus, and equipment, firsthand. In a fire, mere seconds can mean the difference between a safe escape and a tragedy. Fire safety education isn't just for children. Teenagers, adults, and the elderly are also at risk in the event of a fire, making it important for every member of the community to take some time every October during Fire Prevention Week to make sure they understand how to stay safe in case of a fire. This year's fire prevention week campaign is "Cooking safety starts with you. Pay attention to fire prevention".

EARTHQUAKE PREPAREDNESS

THE GREAT SHAKEOUT IS OCTOBER 19, 2023

The Great ShakeOut is a day when millions of people around the world will participate in earthquake drills at work, school, or home. At 10:19 am (local time) on October 19th, you can join people across California practicing earthquake safety. This is an opportunity to practice how to protect ourselves and our loved ones during an earthquake.

Federal, state, and local emergency management experts and other official preparedness organizations all agree that "Drop, Cover, and Hold On" is the appropriate action to reduce injury and death during earthquakes. Your past experience in earthquakes may give you a false sense of safety; you didn't do anything, or you ran outside, yet you survived with no injuries. Or perhaps you got under your desk, and others thought you overreacted.

However, you likely have never experienced the kind of strong earthquake shaking that is possible in much larger earthquakes: sudden and intense back-and-forth motions of several feet per second will cause the floor or the ground to jerk sideways out from under you, and every unsecured object around you could topple, fall, or become airborne, potentially causing serious injury. This is why it's vital to learn to protect yourself immediately after the first jolt... don't wait to see if the earthquake shaking will be strong!

In most situations, if you feel shaking or get an earthquake alert, the Great ShakeOut organization recommends that you immediately:



Drop: where you are, onto your hands and knees. This position protects you from being knocked down and reduces your chances of being hit by falling or flying objects.

Cover: your head and neck with one arm and hand.

- If a sturdy table or desk is nearby, crawl underneath for shelter.
- If no shelter is nearby, crawl next to an interior wall.
- Stay on your knees; bend over to protect vital organs.

Hold On: until the shaking stops.

- **Under shelter:** hold on to it with one hand; be ready to move with your shelter if it shifts.
- **No shelter:** hold on to your head and neck with both arms and hands.

If you use a walker or wheelchair: LOCK your wheels (if applicable). If using a walker carefully, get as low as possible. Bend over and COVER your head/neck with your arms, a book, or a pillow. Then HOLD ON until the shaking stops.

If you use a cane: DROP, COVER, and HOLD ON or sit on a chair, bed, etc. and cover your head and neck with both hands. Keep your cane near you so it can be used when the shaking stops.

A maximum of six (6) banker box size containers will be accepted from each household or business location in Placentia. No electronic items, hazardous materials, or business e-waste will be accepted at this event. At this contactless drive-thru event, we ask that all participants stay in their vehicles and have their shred items packaged in a bag(s) or the box(es) in their back seat or trunk.

UPDATE ON SB 1383 ORGANICS RECYCLING PROGRAM

The City of Placentia, along with every city in the state of California, is required by State law to implement enforcement compliance with both recycling and organic waste recycling programs. California Senate Bill 1383 (SB 1383), requires reductions of organic waste in landfills as part of a greater plan to reduce emissions of short-lived climate pollutants.

Organic waste includes food waste such as vegetables, fruits, cooked meats scraps, dairy, bread, pasta, rice, grains, eggshells, coffee grounds, tea bags, plate scraps, food-soiled paper (i.e., used pizza boxes), and yard waste such as tree trimmings, grass clippings and leaves, and nonhazardous wood waste. SB 1383 establishes targets to achieve a 50% reduction in statewide disposal of organic waste from the 2014 level by 2020 and a 75% reduction by 2025.

The City and Republic Services will provide further information to residents once a Citywide Organics Recycling Programs is implemented. Organics recycling service is available to businesses.

PLACENTIA'S "EXPAND THE FOREST" PROGRAM

The City of Placentia is still accepting applications for its Expand the Forest Program! This program, adopted as part of the City's Urban Forest Management Program, allows residents to purchase and dedicate a tree to commemorate a loved one or special event. Planting a tree in a City Park is a special way to honor a loved one and provides a gift to the whole community by contributing to the expansion of the City's Urban Forest. A dedication tree can be planted in a City Park, and potential tree sponsors can use a Park map to identify their preferred park and planting location(s). The cost to purchase and plant a tree will be funded by the tree

sponsor and is based on the current contract price paid by the City for 24-inch box trees. The current cost is \$300 for an Expand the Forest tree. Once a location is selected, and payment for the tree has been received, the City will arrange to have the tree planted by the City's landscape maintenance contractor, with or without the sponsor(s) in attendance, depending on their preference. Once planted, the City will assume maintenance responsibilities to care for the tree. The tree sponsor(s) will receive a certificate signed by the Mayor in appreciation of their tree sponsorship and be acknowledged in the City's quarterly Palm Newsletter.







FY 2022-23 Roadway Rehabilitation Project

- 1.7 million square feet of streets including Kraemer Boulevard and Bradford Avenue
- Status: Under Final Design
- Timeline: Fall 2023 - Spring 2024

Park Projects

Koch Park Playground Renovations, Phase II

- Phase II includes the installation of two new play structures that will represent the Public Works and Police Departments and complete the "First Responders" theme by complementing the Fire and Life Safety Department play area
- Project Budget: \$600,000
- Timeline: Fall 2023
